The first resident from GBAHC's on-site GED program at [Barclay Greenmount Apartments](#) graduated in February! Anxious to take advantage of the degree, BGA's first graduate enrolled in a local community college for the Fall. Two additional participants have taken the test and are awaiting their scores and another participant has enrolled in a local vocational insititute and is scheduled to graduate in Spring of 2011.
